

PUBLIC SERVICE REFORM IN AFRICA

This year marks the 11th Continental Africa Public Service Day. The day provides an opportunity to reflect on the critical role that the public service plays in sustaining democratic governance. The 2026 United Nations Public Service Day is being observed under the theme "Transforming Public Institutions: Advancing Innovation, Accountability, Participation and Inclusion."

To mark the occasion, the New South Institute (NSI) invites you to a webinar exploring public service reform across Africa. While governance challenges in South Africa are often treated as unique, many countries across the continent grapple with similar questions about state capability, political-administrative relations, and the professionalisation of public institutions. 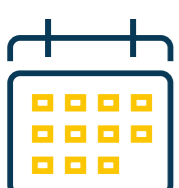
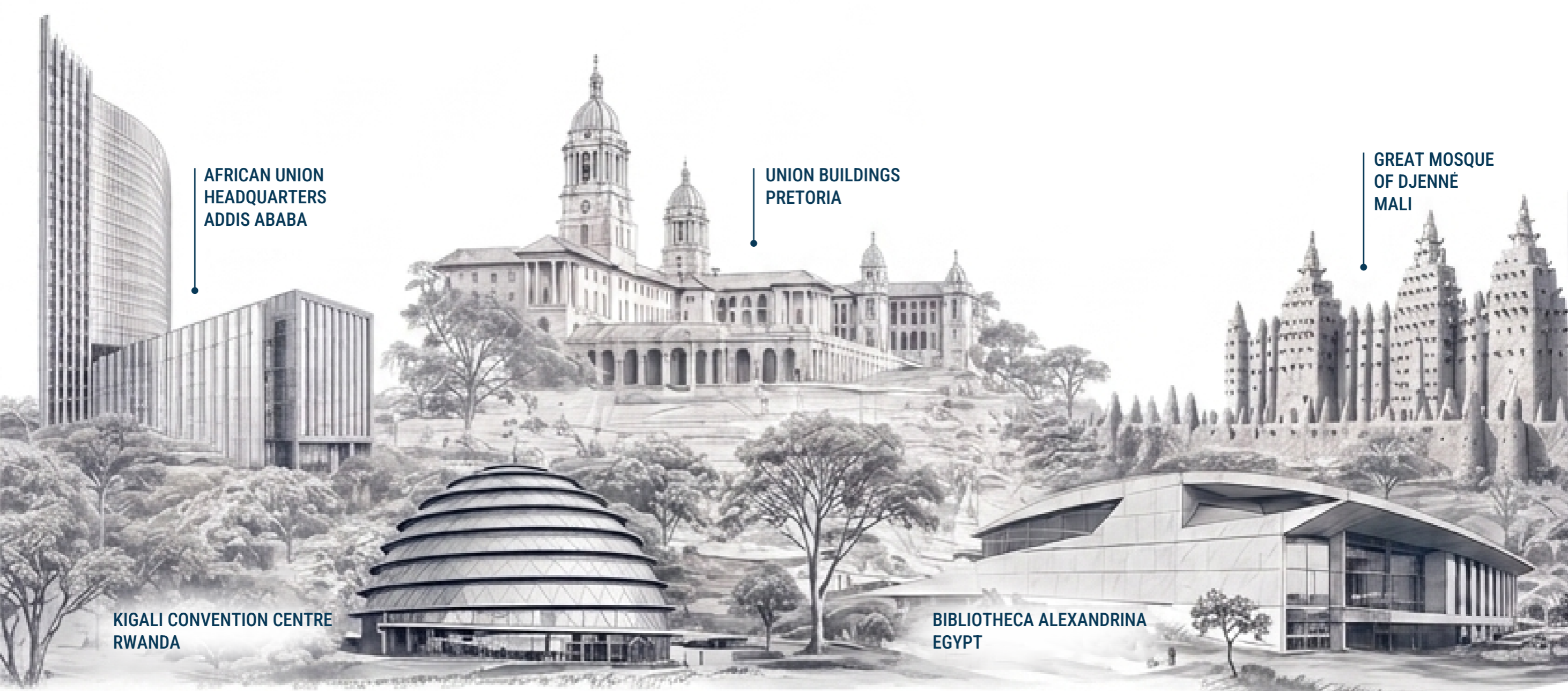
